

## **SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS FOR VISITORS**

We produce hydroelectricity sustainably and cost-efficiently. Sustainability means that we take care of people and the environment. Systematic operations and continuous learning are part of our cost-efficiency. Our safety work is based on these principles.

The visit's host is responsible for your safety. Walk around the power plant in the host's company only, follow the instructions and keep at a safe distance from the production machinery. The machines and devices are remote-controlled. High-voltage systems have an arc flash hazard which means that it is possible to get an electric shock without touching the live part.

Significant magnetic fields are formed within the systems. Therefore, it is important that you inform your host in case you have medical implants, such as a pacemaker. When you follow the instructions, the power plant environment is safe for you. The power plant area and facilities have video surveillance.

**In an emergency,** please call the national emergency number **112.** Follow the instructions you are given. Hang up only after you have been given permission by the emergency service person.

**Please let us know** about any of your possible safety-related observations so that we may develop our operations.

## AT THE POWER PLANT

## Follow these instructions

- Always hold onto the railing
- Take care not to slip or trip
- Choose a safe location to have a phone call
- Park your car in the designated spot
- Ask for permission to take photos
- Find out the nearest exit and the place of assembly
- Remember that use of alcohol and drugs is prohibited in the power plant area
- Smoke only in the designated areas

## Personal protective equipment

- Safety glasses
- Helmet
- Reflective vest
- Hearing protector in noisy areas
- Additional protective equipment on worksites as instructed by the visit's host
